

JET to Space: Competition Terms and Conditions

Promoters and who can enter:

The promoters of this competition are the Jon Egging Trust ('JET'), Spaceport Cornwall and Virgin Unite, in association with RAF St Mawgan and Virgin Orbit.

The competition will involve a teacher, on behalf of their class or school, answering two questions and submitting a JET to Space message, in any file format, by uploading a link to the competition entry portal: <https://www.joneggingtrust.org.uk/jettospace/> (the "Website").

The Competition will run from 00:01 GMT on 9 May 2022 until 23:59 GMT on 8 June 2022 (the "Closing Date").

The competition is open to all teachers and subject leads across the U.K. More than one teacher is permitted to enter from the same school.

Five winning schools will be selected by a judging panel who will score the two questions answered by teachers, and their school / class's JET to Space message, based on a standardised approach across all entries. The judges' decision is final.

Teachers will be notified by email on or before 15 June 2022 (the "Announcement Date"). JET will then consult with the five winning teachers / schools to determine which five pupils within their respective school best meet the eligibility criteria and would benefit from the Space Camp residential experience.

Due to the residential nature of the prize, pupils must be aged 11 – 13 (school years 7 – 8) and resident in the UK. JET will liaise with the winning schools to confirm logistics and provide risk assessment and safeguarding information.

Space Camp Eligibility Criteria:

Pupils who will be deemed eligible for the residential prize must meet one or more of JET's Blue Skies eligibility criteria, with a particular focus on pupils who are struggling to engage in the classroom due to low confidence and self-esteem:

- Students in families living below the poverty line / eligible for free school meals
- Students who have experienced trauma (bereavement, abuse, family breakdown)
- Young carers
- Students who are looked after or in care
- Students on the SEND register (Special Educational Needs and Disability)
- Service children

Residential Event

The prize is the opportunity for 25 pupils (5 from each of 5 schools) to attend a residential space camp experience in Cornwall. Up to 2 teachers from each school and the 5 eligible pupils they nominate must be available to attend the event from 11 to 14 July 2022. Travel costs, accommodation and all activities plus food, drink and incidental expenses will be covered by JET, Virgin Unite and Spaceport Cornwall, the competition sponsors.

All schools who enter the competition will also be invited to take part in a VIP interactive virtual seminar in September 2022 where they will meet the pilots and space engineers behind the historic Kernow Sat 1 launch.

Judging panel

Representatives from JET and from the competition sponsors will form the judging panel and apply a scoring grid to grade each school or teacher's answers and their JET to Space messages. The judges' decision is final.
